Purpose:	To conduct cutting edge research about undergraduate research in science (ca. 50%), and co-lead the Translational Ecology for Undergraduates program at Cary Institute and the Sustainable Urban Water Undergraduate Research Program through the Urban Water Innovation Network (ca. 50%).

Duration:	One year, full time position, with possibility for a second year contingent upon funding. Preferred start date is in summer 2019.

Qualifications:	<ul> <li>Ph.D. in education strongly preferred or in a relevant field of natural or social science.</li> <li>Research experience studying undergraduate student learning and vocational development, preferably in the context of mentored research experiences.</li> <li>Excellent analytical and research skills in both qualitative and quantitative methods.</li> <li>Coursework in environmental science required, and research experience in science preferred.</li> <li>Ability to counsel undergraduate students, and to support scientist mentors.</li> <li>Strong organizational, interpersonal and writing skills.</li> </ul>
Responsibilities:	<ul> <li>Plan and implement research about students in the two undergraduate research programs led by Cary Institute:</li> <li>o Translational Ecology for Undergraduates – This 12 week program engages 8-13 students from ecology and environmental science in mentored research at Cary Institute. It is an NSF-supported Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU) program and will be in its 33<sup>rd</sup> year in 2019.</li> <li>o Undergraduate Research Program in Urban Water Sustainability. This program engages 9-10 students from natural and social science and engineering in mentored research at institutions across the country. The 9 week program starts and ends at Colorado State University in Ft. Collins, CO. It is part of the Urban Water Innovation Network, an NSF-supported Sustainability Research Network. It will be entering its 4<sup>th</sup> year in 2019.</li> <li>This will entail:</li> <li>o Organizing data from the past programs</li> <li>o Identifying cutting edge research questions that can be addressed with these data, such as the nature of long-term influences of research experience, or describing multivariate patterns of student response to participation.</li> <li>o Pursuing these questions through qualitative and quantitative analysis</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Planning and implementing new data collection with participants in upcoming programs to complement and contribute to work with the existing data.</li> <li>Presenting results of the research at conference and through publication.</li> <li>Help write grant proposals to continue both programs beyond 2020.</li> <li>Serve as Program Leader for both programs. This will entail: <ul> <li>Plan, organize and provide logistical support for mentors and students in both programs.</li> <li>Advertise each program broadly to ensure a large and diverse pool of qualified applicants.</li> <li>Provide support for participating undergraduate students and their mentors.</li> <li>Process student applications and assist in the selection process.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Maintain an alumni database with contact and current status information.</li> <li>Manage the program budgets.</li> </ul>
	o Help prepare annual reports, papers and presentations about the program.
